At the start of each seasonal term, parents are told about our plans for their children and how we will be using the money from the Pupil Premium Grant. We provide parent consultation evenings three times a year and an annual pupil report. In the interim periods, we operate an open-door policy, enabling parents to approach school if they have questions. Equally, we contact parents if we feel there are particular issues to discuss.

Barriers to learning are identified, progress analysed and needs addressed throughout the year as part of our regular assessment and review procedures. We look at attainment against year group expectations as well as the children's progress against their own prior attainment. Pupils are treated as individuals and their progress is analysed and their needs are addressed accordingly.

We use our Parent Support Advisor to offer parents practical support with issues that they might be facing, including parenting or financial problems. We use our teaching and support staff to ensure progress and attainment is strong.

The Pupil Premium website information is updated at the start of the academic year.

The Effect of Expenditure 2017-18

Progress

The Pupil Premium end of year data is based on 11 children. We track progress and attainment throughout the year based on the school's own tracking and assessment systems that are aligned to the National Curriculum. Due to the small cohort numbers, and our concern that data should be kept anonymous, we report results across the school, rather than within each year group or at key reporting points.

Below is a progress chart, showing the progress of children from Y1-Y6 during 2017-18, comparing the progress of children who are eligible for Pupil Premium funding with the progress of the rest of the school.

On average all children at Oare exceeded expected in-year progress.

On average the 11 Pupil Premium children also exceeded expected in-year progress expectations - quite significantly in Reading and Maths.

Parent Advisor Support

The school employed a Parent Advisor, Jill Shankland during 2017-18, who was available for advice and support. We advertised her services via the school newsletter and via the parent information points at school. If issues arose, we signposted parents for her help and support.
